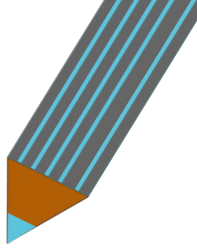

Basic Bits of Grammar

Today we will look at THREE of them. **Verbs, Adjectives & Adverbs**

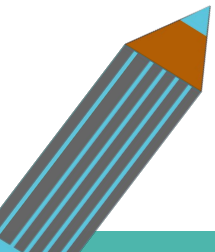
Let's learn how to use them properly!

Verbs

Verbs are **ACTION** words - they are what happens in the sentence.

Highlight the **verb** which best suits the sentence below.

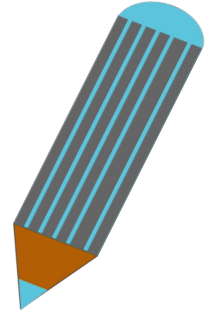
The plane	<i>fly/flew/flying</i>	over France

Verbs

Verbs are **ACTION** words - they are what happens in the sentence.

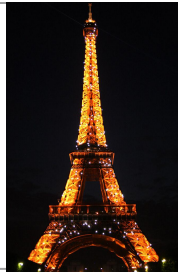
